
Welcome to Zion Lutheran Church & Preschool!

Communion Statement





Epistle Reading – Hebrews 7:23–28

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office, but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. Consequently, he is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

For it was indeed fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, innocent, unstained, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people, since he did this once for all when he offered up himself. 
Holy Gospel

and the life + of the world to come. Amen.



BIBLE VERSE

Bless the LORD, . . . who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy.

Psalm 103:2, 4

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

God sends Samuel to anoint the next king of Israel, with the reminder, "The Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7). God rejects each of Jesse's sons, so Samuel sends for the youngest, David, whom God has chosen to become the greatest king of Israel. Surviving Saul's Insane Jealousy, David becomes king and establishes Jerusalem as his stronghold.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—When God told Samuel to anoint David, He said that He doesn't look at outward appearances but at the heart. What does this mean? Why is this a good thing?
- At Mealtime—When young David cared for his father's sheep, he learned useful skills that helped him in the future. Talk about one skill each person in your family is learning now that will probably be helpful in the future.
- Something to Do—When David was young, God chose him for a very important job as king. Have each member of the family make a list of jobs he or she can do. Pray together, asking God to help you perform these jobs well and to His glory.
- Before Bed—King David was the leader of the nation of Israel. Pray together before bed, asking God to bless and guide your nation's leader.

What is the "Benediction"?

The Benediction (pronounced ben-eh-DIK-shun) is God's blessing for the congregation given through the pastor at the very end of the service. There are several different benedictions that we use in the church. The Aaronic Benediction is the one that we use in the Divine Service. You can find this in Num. 6:24–26. We use the other benedictions in other services like Matins and Vespers. Can you find the benedictions for these services in your hymnal?



Why is there a Benediction in the Divine Service?

The word "benediction" comes from the Latin word "bene" which means "well," and "dicere" which means "speak." When the pastor pronounces the Benediction, God is giving us His blessing, or speaking well to us. He sends us on our way with His blessing after we have received His wonderful gifts through the Word and Sacraments. God sure does a lot of giving to His people!



Parents:

Before or after the Divine Service, direct your children to the various services in the hymnal. Encourage them to find and read the benedictions for each service. Help them to find the Aaronic Benediction.
