Communion Statement

We believe that in the Lord's Supper, Christ's physical body and blood are present in the bread and wine (1Cor. 11:23-25). We also believe receiving the Lord's Supper is an act of church fellowship. Scripture cautions that those who receive without recognizing Christ's body and blood will bring judgment upon themselves (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore, out of love to our guests, we invite to our altar to receive the Lord's Supper those who are baptized, confirmed, repentant members of Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod congregations or sister congregations. If you are visiting us today from another Christian denomination, we welcome you to come to the altar to receive a baptismal blessing. Please signify by crossing your arms over your chest upon kneeling.



Epistle Reading – 2 Corinthians 5:16–21



So he told them this parable: . . .










Nicene Creed

This Week in Sunday School

A recap of today's SS teaching for Zion parents & students

BIBLE VERSE

Christ died for our sins.

1 Corinthians 15:3

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

The events of Christ's crucifixion unfold in a series of brutal and bloody vignettes: questioned before Pilate, mocked and abused by the Roman guard, nailed to the cross. Jesus hangs between life and death—abandoned by His Father—yielding up His life at the moment He chooses. Multiple witnesses see where Christ is laid in a borrowed tomb.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—At Jesus' trials, the judges wanted to know the truth. Tell the truth about Jesus.
- At Mealtime—Pilate gave orders that Jesus should be killed even though he knew Jesus was innocent. Why did this happen? You deserve death because you are guilty of sinning, yet God gives you life. Why does this happen?
- Something to Do—As a family, make a mosaic cross from torn squares of colored paper.
- Before Bed—Why did Jesus have to die on the cross? Why did God the Father forsake Jesus while He was crucifled? Because Jesus suffered and died in your place, what precious gift do you receive?



KIDS IN THE DIVINE SERVICE

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There's one word we often use in the Church that isn't used during Lent. Usually we use it after responsories, antiphons and other parts of our worship. Have you guessed what the word is yet? If you guessed "alleluia," then you are right. We stop singing and saying "alleluia" during Lent and won't speak it again until Easter morning.

What does "alleluia" mean and why don't we say it during Lent?

"Alleluia" is a Hebrew word that means "Praise the Lord." Since we focus on the sufferings and death of Jesus during Lent, we stop using this joyful word until we celebrate Jesus' glorious resurrection. On Easter morning the first words you hear will be: "The Lord is risen. He is risen indeed! Alleluia!"

Parents:



During worship, help your children to look for places in the service where "alleluia" has been omitted. Notice the red writing in the hymnal. These words will help to point out when and where we might use or refrain from using the "a" word.
