
Communion Statement

We believe that in the Lord's Supper, Christ's physical body and blood are present in the bread and wine (1 Cor. 11:23-25). We also believe receiving the Lord's Supper is an act of church fellowship. Scripture cautions that those who receive without recognizing Christ's body and blood will bring judgment upon themselves (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore, out of love to our guests, we invite to our altar to receive the Lord's Supper those who are baptized, confirmed, repentant members of Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod congregations or sister congregations. If you are visiting us today from another Christian denomination, we welcome you to come to the altar to receive a baptismal blessing. Please signify by crossing your arms over your chest upon kneeling.

In preparation to receive the Lord's Supper in a worthy manner please consider reading "Christian Questions with their Answers" on Page 329-330. If you are interested in exploring membership, please talk with Pastor Grimenstein or call the church office.

Our Worship

Our worship services are based on traditional church liturgies in which God speaks to us in His Word and we respond to Him. These liturgies were used by the early church almost 2000 years ago and are rich in scriptural meaning, connecting us to our past -- and future -- in Christ Jesus. There is a depth to Lutheran worship that can take time to appreciate, thus you may find that you don't understand everything that is happening the first week you visit. That's OK, we encourage you to keep visiting!




Epistle Reading - Colossians 1:13-20

He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Holy Gospel

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-third chapter.



And there followed [Jesus] a great multitude of the people and of women who were mourning and lamenting for him. But turning to them Jesus said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For behold, the days are coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren and the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' Then they will begin to say to the


mountains, 'Fall on us,' and to the hills, 'Cover us.' For if they do these things when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?"

Two others, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments. And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong." And he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And he said to him, "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."




Service of the Sacrament

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven;



Zion will be designating all offerings at our Thanksgiving Eve Services to the Siberian Lutheran Mission Society's work of creating a seminary endowment. You may donate via check or cash in your envelope. Please make all checks payable to "Siberian Lutheran Mission Society." You may also mail your check to the church office or contribute online.

The Siberian Lutheran Mission Society is working to help support our Siberian Lutheran brethren. They raise funds to support the Pastoral Office in the Siberian Lutheran congregations. They also gather funds to purchase Communion kits, Altar ware, Bibles, VBS materials, and so forth.

Today, the Siberian Church and the seminary face a new threat as war brings death and destruction to Ukraine. The seminary in Novosibirsk is under stress on many levels. Students and their families are struggling under high inflation, the impending military draft, and anxiety over what the future holds.

According to Rev. Dr. Quill, Director of the Save the Seminary Campaign,

"Now is the time to demonstrate our trust in the Lord's promise that the 'gates of hell shall not prevail against [His church]'. We will not cut and run, but instead redouble our efforts to complete the Save the Seminary Campaign endowment. Donations will continue to be safely invested in and managed by Lutheran financial foundations in the US".

But the LORD is the true God.


Jeremiah 10:10

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

God guides Moses to release His people from their slavery in Egypt, but Pharaoh proves less than cooperative. A series of plagues—foretold by Moses and sent by God—brings destruction and pain upon the Egyptians but only serves to harden Pharaoh's heart against Moses and the Israelites.

TAKING IT HOME

- On the Go—How did the signs and miracles God performed through Moses and Aaron answer Pharaoh's question, "Who is the LORD?" (Exodus 5:2). What would be your answer to this question?
- At Meal Time—What do you think it means that God "hardened" Pharaoh's heart? How does God send the Holy Spirit to soften your heart in faith toward Him?
- Something to Do—God says in Exodus 6:1 that He has a "strong hand." Trace your hand on a piece of paper and write this Bible verse inside it: "The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer" (Psalm 18:2).
- Before Bed—God sent darkness over Egypt for three days. Of what story in the New Testament does this remind you? How does God use you to shine His light on others?

Why do we celebrate it?
