Happy Whatever-Doesn't-Offend-You


For years, we have been told that there is a "war on Christmas." For years, we have been told (or tell others) to "keep Christ in Christmas." And while there is a need to "remember the reason for the season" and decry its misunderstanding (as I am writing this on Thanksgiving Monday, people have already camped out at Best Buy to capitalize on "Black Friday" sales), I want to show you what I think is the silver-lining around the dark clouds of the secularization of America and, in particular, the Christmas holiday.

Lutheranism is the only major branch of Protestant theology that understands the separation of church and state as being part of God's design for civil society and life in the kingdom. God controls the "kingdom of left" (or the State) by means of the Law; He governs the "kingdom of the right" (or the Church) by means of the Law and the Gospel. The role of the State is to punish wrongdoing and leave the law abiding alone; the role of the Church is to proclaim Gospel of Jesus Christ and be the vehicle through which God saves people eternally. History has shown that neither the State nor the Church functions as designed when one interferes with the affairs of the other. Basically, it's not wise to give clergy a standing army or a politician a pulpit.

To an unhealthy degree, the Church has allowed elements of civil society inform people about Jesus during the Christmas season. In doing so, the name of Jesus was used, but the true meaning of Christmas was lost, replaced with "peace on earth, goodwill to men" (and so on). There is no atonement, no forgiveness, no resurrection in civil society's talk of "Christmas."

Now, with civil society taking a more secular approach, she does not feel the need to speak about Christmas. Instead, she prefers any number of amorphous congenial seasonally appropriate greetings. Civil society (the kingdom of the left), in abandoning speaking the name of Jesus, has given back to the Church (the kingdom of the right) what was her divine mandate all along: to speak the name of Jesus and proclaim the gospel in truth and purity.

There are many things that are problematic with our culture becoming increasingly secularized. Life is not valued as a God-given and miraculous gift;



the acquisition of material possessions is prized as man's chief end; trust in the governing authorities is esteemed greater than trust in God; and charity is replaced with welfare. However, there is at least one silver-lining: the Church is now the only voice speaking the name of Jesus to a world that needs to hear the good news. Not having to compete with other voices, we can clearly be heard as we proclaim that, in Christ, we all have forgiveness, life and salvation!


