From Fear To Faith

From Bible-in-a-Year to Verse-a-Week, our focus has shifted from immersing ourselves with the general contents of Scripture to focusing in on a number of verses that speak to the important matters of faith and life, of Christ and salvation, of God and man. As I am writing this, the passage we are memorizing is Hebrews 1:1-3. This is the first memory passage that is... well... a passage and not a verse. It's long. It's also incredibly jam-packed with content about who Jesus is.

The book of Hebrews is unique. It is the only book of the New Testament whose author is unknown to us. This may not seem interesting, but when you consider that the two litmus tests a book had to pass to be considered part of the New Testament Canon were apostolic authorship and doctrinal purity, you begin to realize just how high an opinion the early church had about the content of the book of Hebrews that it was willing to waive one of the requirements for being in the Bible to allow for its acceptance in the canon. It's as if the early church said: "We don't care who wrote the book of Hebrews; we want this in the canon, we recognize it is divinely inspired."

And so this book, this unique, divinely-inspired book, begins with the words we have memorized: Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power.

After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high. It is said that if you want to know what Jesus did, read the gospels; but if you want to know who Jesus is read Hebrews. And it is hard to imagine three verses of Scripture that teach us as much about who Jesus is than the opening three verses of Hebrews!

When we come to the knowledge of who Jesus is (the creator, sustainer, heir and redeemer of creation), and that this Jesus chose us to be saved in him before the foundation of the world, things change. Eternally they are changed because of his atoning death on the cross, which reconciled the Father to us. And things are changed for us right now too! No longer do we need to live in the shame of past mistakes. We do not need to live with the guilt of our sins that hurt our neighbor and shame our Lord. We also do not need to live in fear of what lurks on the other side of every decision we make, because Christ is with us, beside us, and in front of us.

Faith trusts the words of Hebrews 1:1-3. It joyfully acknowledges that Christ right now is sustaining creation and that he has a vested interest in the creation increasing in value because he will one day inherit it. We trust that all things are in the all-powerful hands of the one who has demonstrated his love by shedding his blood for us. Fear rejects this. Fear paralyzes us and tricks us into thinking that it is virtuous to remain perfectly still, to do nothing. Fear makes us think that the universe is out to get us, or that as the forces of evil conspire against us our Lord is either unwilling or unable to come to our aid and work out all things together for good. Faith compels action. As Luther wrote: "Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. And so it is impossible for it not to do good works incessantly. It does not ask whether there are good works to do, but before the question rises, it has already done them, and is always at the doing of them."

As individual people and as a corporate body of faith, may God continue to give us the Holy Spirit and faith, so that we would not be paralyzed by fear, but energized and motivated by the Gospel—who our Lord Jesus Christ is and what he has done!



Notes From the Preschool

Greetings from the Preschool! January has come and gone and registrations are underway for the 2013-2014 year. Crazy, isn't it?... but we still have a lot to do before the end of this school year.

During chapel this month, the children will learn that Jesus was once small just like them, and grew, just like them. Pastor Duncan will be teaching the lesson. The children love when Pastor Duncan comes to

share Jesus time with them...they are even teaching him all of the fun songs we do during Kids Praise.

The teachers are also busy conducting PreKindergarten evaluations. Before children enter Kindergarten, we test them on specific skills that are needed for Kindergarten. We then hold conferences with their parents and review the test results. It is our goal to give the parents as much information as possible before having to make the decision to send to Kindergarten, or to put them into a class like our Stepping Stones class.

Each February our school focuses on Jesus' love for us. As a way for us to show love to others, our school has teamed up with the Sunday School in participating in a mission project that reaches out to the local community and beyond. This February we will be supporting our troops overseas through the non-profit organization **Operation: Stars and Stripes, Inc.** We are collecting items that are desperately needed, and appreciated, by our troops and their families. If you would like to help our cause, we are collecting travel sized items such as soaps, shampoo, lip balms, gum, toothpaste and toothbrushes, and drink mix singles. Collection boxes are located outside the classrooms in the school lobby.

Please continue to keep our school in your prayers especially as we enter registration for the next school year. What a tremendous opportunity we have to preach the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ to small children.
