Too Much of a Good Thing

Later this month we will celebrate, in rapid-fire succession, Good Friday and Easter Sunday—the death and resurrection of Jesus. If you ask the mythical creature called the "average Christian" what the death of Jesus did for him or her, they would include forgiveness, salvation, and eternal life in their answer. Then, if you asked the same person what the resurrection of Jesus did for him or her, they would again include forgiveness, salvation, and eternal life. Is the mythical-creature-average-Christian right? Does the death of Jesus do for us what his resurrection also does? Are the benefits they have for us redundant? Or, to put it bluntly, are the final events we celebrate and remember during Holy Week a giant yet indistinguishable pile of too much of a good thing?

When it comes to the death and resurrection of Jesus, both are necessary for our salvation, both are necessary for us to be forgiven, and both are necessary for us to have eternal life.

When Jesus died on the cross, he took our place, suffering for us and paying the penalty our sins deserve. You've probably heard that before, but let me explain. The Bible teaches that death is both the natural result of sin and the penalty for sinning. Without sin, there is no death. Without death, there is no sin. We believe that Jesus lived a perfect life—that he was conceived and born without the "sin nature" we inherited from our parents. As such, Jesus would never have had to either pay the penalty for sinning, or experience the consequences of sin in his life. In other words, there was no reason why Jesus had to die. But he did die. And so the question is: why?

Or, more accurately, what killed Jesus? Answer: since Jesus had no sin of his own to die for, it must have been someone else's sin that killed Jesus. Whose? Yours and mine. In something called the "great exchange" Jesus takes our sin upon himself and suffers the consequences in his body on the cross. Consequently, Jesus gives us the benefits of his perfect life, meaning that there is no punishment we have to fear for our sins.

When Jesus rose from the dead, he accomplished something that no human being had ever done before: he conquered death. Oh sure, there have been a smattering of people who came back from the dead as recorded in the Bible, but all of those got old and died (again). Jesus, on the other hand, came back from the dead and has not died again. His resurrection is unique, and it proves that death—while tragic—is not final, nor does it need to be permanent. Jesus found a way to come back from the dead and live forever. And the good news is that he has promised to do for us what he did for himself—overcome death forever.

Between his death and resurrection, Jesus has given us too much of a good thing! From not needing to fear punishment for our sins to the promise that we will live forever, Jesus has done more for us in his death and resurrection than would could have ever asked for or imagined!

God bless you as you remember and celebrate the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Good Friday service will be held at 7:00 PM on March 29.


Easter Sunday services will be held at the normal times (8:00 AM and 10:30 AM). There will be no Bible Class in between services. Instead,
