2 Corinthians 8:9

"For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich."

St. Paul writes these words in his second canonical epistle to the church at Corinth. I had the privilege of preaching on this text last month, as it was one of our memory verses. More than most, this text stuck out to me as a wonderful picture of the kind of savior we have.

This verse reminded me of the TV show "Undercover Bosses." In this show, CEO's of various companies would take entry-level jobs in their corporation to experience first-hand what their employees faced on a daily basis. They also got to listen to employees share their candid opinions about "the man."

In laying aside the riches of the attributes of his divine nature—it's power, wisdom, and omnipresence—Christ entered our world like an Undercover Boss would enter the workplace of his company as an entry-level grunt, under the guise of anonymity. In this "poverty" of his State of Humiliation (as the theologians like to call it), Christ lived for over three decades, experiencing and observing what you and I do and how you and I live. He experienced the heartbreak and grief, the joys and celebrations that fill in the gaps of everyday living. He grew up learning to walk, talk, and go about his day. He made friends, worked with his hands and celebrated things like marriages. He became like us; he became poor. But his poverty as the God-man knew nothing greater that suffering and death, tasting the punishment of sin for all mankind. He experienced the ultimate poverty of being forsaken by his Father.

And now you and I, in the words of 2 Corinthians 8:9, have become rich. We have been given the forgiveness of sins, fellowship with God, and the promise of resurrection to eternal life. Such riches are beyond our ability to comprehend, and far beyond our ability to earn. They are a true gift, given by the one who so loved the world that, though he was rich became poor, so that we, through his poverty, might become rich.

2013-2014 Bowling Season

Wait, wasn't the 2012-2013 bowling banquet over just a few weeks ago? Yes, but we still need a league president, treasurer, and secretary. Without these posts filled, we cannot have a bowling league for the 2013-2014 season, which starts in late August or early September.

League President: We're reluctant to call the job a "figurehead" position, but the league president is only responsible for signing the contract with the bowling alley before the season begins, and signing for the distribution of funds after the season is over. It doesn't get much easier than that. (retiring president, Pastor Duncan McLellan)

League Treasurer: Before each bowling session, the treasurer collects bowling fees from each bowler and records the amount in a journal. After each bowling session, the treasurer counts the money and presents it to the bowling alley. The alley acts as our banker during the season (so you don't have to go to a bank or keep the money at home). At the end of the season the treasurer makes sure all the bowlers are paid up and that the bowling banquet is fully funded. (retiring treasurer, Mary Lou Neill)

League Secretary: Before the bowing season begins, the secretary organizes the teams. During the season, the secretary collects the results of the evenings league play and presents them to the alley. The alley then tabulates the results, and supplies print outs of the leagues standings, averages and other statistics. At the end of the season, the secretary plans the bowling banquet. (retiring secretary, Marianne Miller)



Thank You, Zion!

Dear Zion Lutheran Church congregation,

Twenty years ago I was asked to consider teaching the three year-old preschool program here at Zion Lutheran Church. It was much to consider since my only early childhood education had come from the University of Life. Having raised three of my own children and over twenty of the neighborhood children through home-care, my youngest was about to enter first grade. It seemed God had been preparing me for this new path in my life, even though I did not realize it at the time.

I prayed for God to guide me in this decision and began the search for His answer. The result was where you would expect; in His word. After preparing two devotions to read for Zion's Dial-A-Devotion ministry I found out I was not able to attend the recording session; this was all in God's plan. Had I recorded these devotions as planned I would have filed them away and they would not have been within my reach to stumble upon them. God used them in answer to my prayer.

In the first devotion I was reminded that God has promised us even more than His own Son. He's promised us power through the Spirit—power that will help us do all that He asks of us—power that will strengthen our weak knees and faint hearts. As Paul put it; "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" Philippians 4:13. "So what does God expect of you today?" The devotion went on. Does it seem like a bit too much? Do you feel backed into a corner? Remember all He asks from you is everything. And all He offers you is the power to do just that.

If that wasn't enough to bless me with encouragement the Lord sent these additional words; At such a time when fear grips your heart and your faith weakens and wavers pray that the Lord will open your eyes that you may see. There's no less of a force surrounding you on the front lines of the battlefield as there was in Elisha's day. But all you really need is the One who promised never to leave or forsake you, the One who said, "Lo, I am with you always" Matthew 28:20. You don't need an army on your side when you've got the King of kings.

I was installed as the Preschool teacher in August of 1993. "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your request to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:4-7

I give thanks to God for this awesome opportunity to serve Him here as Preschool Teacher at Zion Lutheran Church for the past twenty years. During 2001 and 2011 I attended night and summer classes and I give thanks to God for blessing me with the encouragement and stamina I needed for earning my degree in Early Childhood Education. My style of teaching has evolved over the years but the message that Jesus loves you remains my constant focus.

Zion has been a big part of my life for the past thirty-some years and I thank God for you all. Having a celebration of the past twenty years was a great joy. Thank you to everyone who had a part in not only making this day so special, but also for all the support and love you have given me along the way.
