Knowledge and Understanding

What was the first day of school like for you? Did you enjoy heading back to school, ready to see your friends and learning new things? Were you sad that Summer Vacation was over and you'd have to start waking up before you wanted to (and while it was still dark out)?

I had my first first day of school in nine years this September, as I started going to Pittsburgh Theological Seminary part-time to earn a Master of Arts in Theology. Sitting in an Old Testament History class with a bunch of first-year seminarians, I was reminded quickly that there is a big difference between KNOWLEDGE and UNDERSTANDING. (And from talking with a number of you about your situation at work, the same truism applies there as well.)

Ezra, the prophet and priest in Israel following their return to Jerusalem after spending 70 years of "time out" in Babylon for worshiping false Gods, brought the people together for a 6 hour worship service. (Please remember that the next time God's Word, the Gospel and the Lord's Supper make you 5 minutes late for the all-important post-church lunch.) He has the men, women, and kids old enough to know what's going on assemble at a large, outdoor venue where the book of the Law of Moses was read. But then, at the end of this passage in Nehemiah 8, we find this odd little detail: "They read from the book, from the Law of God, clearly, and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading." (The "they" in the text are a bunch of guys with hard to pronounce names, representing the leaders of the people.) The point? Ezra was not content merely to read the Old Testament, he made sure the people understood what was being read.

Good thing all of us understand everything we read in Scripture today! Otherwise we'd be left with the awkward scenario of having read Scripture (or hearing it read in places like church), not understanding what we've heard or read and then (...squirrel!) running off to do something else, having no idea what we just heard or read.

This may (or probably may not) come as a surprise to you, but not even your pastor understands everything he reads about in Scripture. But I would savor the opportunity to sit down with you and help you go through some of the passages of Scripture (or teachings of the Christian faith) that you do not understand. There's no shame in calling the church office and saying: "I'd like to talk to pastor." (Or e-mailing me and saying; "we need to meet!")

There's a difference between KNOWING what the Bible says and UNDERSTAND-ING what it means. It would be a privilege to meet with you and help you move from knowledge to understanding. And selfishly, I know I will do the same in our time together. Good things happen when Christians come together to pray together and study God's Word!

Did you know that October was Pastor appreciation month? I was just reminded about it myself and didn't want to let it go unrecognized. So on behalf of


the congregation, I would like to publicly thank Pastor Duncan for his spiritual leadership and especially for his outstanding preaching and teaching ministry.

CONFIRMATION RETREAT

"That's never been done that way before!" Words that usually prophesy raised eyebrows and expectations of failure in the church have been applied this year to how we are going about doing Confirmation Instruction. Instead of weekly hour-long class sessions, we are doing a number of "modules" ranging from a weekend (retreat) to a lock-in at church to a Sunday afternoon at church. But... "it's never been done that way before!" And so we didn't know if it was going to work. But we believed it was worth a try.

And so it came to pass that our eight Confirmation students showed up to church on a Friday evening not knowing what to expect. Vicar and I (and a couple of intrepid volunteers...you know who you are... and THANK YOU!) also had no idea what to expect. Would this "module" approach to Confirmation succeed beyond our wildest dreams, or would it be one of those things we'd agree never to talk about again?

The defining moment came less than two hours in to the lock-in, when one of the students asked: "when are we going to do this again?" Not only did the students pick-up the material we were teaching (in six hour-long sessions), but they were having a ton of fun in the free-time in between (a midnight game of capture the flag will do this).

Our next "module" is coming up in November (15-17) at Camp Jumonville. We will be teaching and learning the New Testament, having fun (hopefully outdoors) and coming to know and love the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ!

We can always use more chaperone help for events like these! Contact Pastor Duncan if you would like to help out, and please remember to keep our Confirmation students in your prayers as they learn the basics of the Christian faith, the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ!


SORRY I SKIPPED CHURCH

I love talking to people after they've been away from church for a couple of weeks because I know what I'm going to get: a frenzied list of why-we-couldn't-be-in-church-no-way-no-how. The only excuse I think I haven't heard is: "to be honest,

Pastor, we just didn't want to wake up and go." (Which means I have, in fact, heard the excuse: "out too late; hung over. Sorry." True story.)

The point is, whether for good reasons or bad, you can't or don't always make it to church on Sunday. You work. You travel. You play sports. You simply sleep in. So what's a pastor to do? Well, I could follow the lead of many who have my job in other congregations and lecture you about priorities, principles, and try to make you feel guilty for not coming back early from your honeymoon to attend worship.
