TOO MANY QUESTIONS

Is there an answer for everything? Is there one response sufficient for the questions we have, the problems we face, and even the good things we have been given (or worked hard to get)? I'm not talking about questions like the firing order on the LT1 engine of the new Corvette Stingray, or why the weather has yet to do a convincing imitation of anything close to resembling spring; I'm talking about questions of importance. May I suggest that there is one answer to questions of ontological and eschatological importance, theodicy, personal struggles, temptations and sin, how we should live our lives, and what there is to life after death: the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The resurrection of Jesus shows us what we have to look forward to when he returns; we will be raised like he was raised. He was not raised like Lazarus, the widow from Nain's son, or the many other people who were brought back to life (resuscitated) in the Bible; he was raised to a life that cannot experience death again, and that is free from the effects of the fallen, sinful world. This is what will happen to us at the day and time known only by the Father, the day our Lord Jesus returns in glory.

The resurrection of Jesus teaches us that bad things happen to good people. Jesus did no wrong, yet he suffered immeasurable pain and torment when he was mocked and flogged, beaten and hung on a cross. When we suffer unjustly, we are imperfectly following in the footsteps of our perfect Savior. He knows what we go through; his resurrection means it will not last forever and that better things are in store for us.


The resurrection of Jesus is God's answer to sin and temptation. Nailed to the cross with Jesus, our sins have been put to death and, just as death no longer has mastery over Jesus, our sins no longer control or have mastery over us. We have been set free from sins and have been made the property of righteousness through Jesus Christ. As long as we are in the flesh we will be tempted to sin, but the one who conquered sin (and death) has provided a way out for us, the

Holy Spirit who teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly desires, as we wait for his coming and our resurrection to eternal life.

The resurrection of Jesus teaches us how to live. It teaches us the power of God over sin and death, allowing us to live a life where anxiety and fear take a back seat to joy and hope.

God bless you all as you prepare to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Mary then sees the risen Christ and speaks with him. Later that day Christ appears to the other disciples. Thomas, however, is not there and does not believe his friends when they tell him Christ is risen. A week later Jesus appears to Thomas and gives him physical proof of his death and Resurrection. John ends the chapter by stating

his purpose in writing his Gospel: to tell all people that Jesus is the Son of God so they too can believe.

Consider leading a Sunday school station in May and/or June!! Contact Katie Gielarowski for more information or to volunteer.





NOTES FROM THE PRESCHOOL

Happy April! I think Spring is finally here... just take a look in our classrooms and you will be convinced too. The children have been very busy learning all about the changes that Spring brings...budding trees, new growth in the ground, how a caterpillar can turn into a butterfly and of course the death and resurrection of Jesus.

April continues to be exciting and busy. On April 1st and 2nd we will be hosting our annual Dads and Donuts breakfast. This is a time when dads can come to school with their child and enjoy donuts, fruit and beverages and lots of fellowship time with the teachers and other dads and children. We decorate with a "Black and Gold" theme and everybody wears their favorite Pittsburgh teams' apparel. Its great fun and such a blessing to see how excited the dads are to participate in their child's school activity, and how they continue to support our school.

We also spent a lot of time learning about the Easter story. I have the pleasure of teaching the chapel lesson this month, and honestly, it is my favorite lesson to teach. I use a set of plastic Easter eggs, each filled with an item that helps tell the story. The children are so excited to see what is in each egg, but will not understand why the last egg is empty, at least, not at first. "Mrs. Tracey....did you forget to put something in the last egg?" This is what I usually hear when I open the last empty egg. I then explain that the last egg represents the empty tomb on Easter morning...Jesus is alive!! Each child will go home with an empty egg including a small piece of paper that says "The empty egg reminds us of the empty tomb. Jesus is Alive!" I encourage the children to show their egg to friends and family, and tell them what they learned.

Registration continues to go very well. We currently have 102 students enrolled for the next school year. We have opened classes in the afternoon to accommodate more children. With the addition of these new classes, we may have the need for additional staff. If this sounds interesting to you, please let me know. I would love to have more members be a part of our wonderful school.

How awesome it is to have the opportunity to teach so many children about the good news of Jesus!

SANCTUARY UPGRADE UPDATE: PHASE 1 NEARLY COMPLETE

The sanctuary renovations are now nearly completed with only the window tinting left unfinished. Once the spring weather has arrived for good, we will move forward with the tinting of all the windows around the chancel including the lower atrium windows at the front entrance to the sanctuary.

Our fund raising efforts were largely successful; however, we are short of the total budgeted project costs. In addition, we incurred several thousand dollars of unbudgeted expenses including painting registers, fees for dumpsters and additional floor preparation before installation. Zion's Council has approved the rollover of the unfunded costs into the Phase 2 air conditioning installation.

Phase 2 fundraising efforts will commence in early April with estimated installation completed before the summer heat begins. Including the additional Phase 1 costs, we are targeting \$50,000 in total funds in order to initiate the air conditioning installation.

This is a very exciting time for Zion and we look forward to everyone pulling together to make this project a reality. May God bless us in our collective efforts as the Body of Christ at Zion Lutheran Church Bridgeville!
