WHY DO YOU SEEK THE LIVING AMONG THE DEAD?


This is the question asked to the women who went to Jesus' tomb early on Sunday morning by the two men in dazzling apparel. Ironically, with burial spices in hand, they were actually looking for the dead among the dead, not the living among the dead. But the question by the men is a good one: why do you seek the living among the dead? Or, maybe more accurately: why do you seek life among dead things? And while their question certainly was relevant to the women on that first Easter Sunday, I think it is even more relevant for us today.

Why do you seek the living among the dead? Why do you seek life among dead things? Why do you think pornography, excessive alcohol consumption, avoiding your spouse, cheating on exams, and premarital sex is where you will find life? Do you really think God is hiding true meaning and happiness behind these sinful facades? Or do you think that truly living means violating the will of the one who created life? Why do you seek the living among the dead?

The question isn't "what does it mean to truly live?" but, "where do I go to find life?" Many of us are living our lives trying to answer the first question, but ignoring the second. Truly living isn't an activity. It's not adrenaline, pleasure, or inexpressible calm. It is found in Jesus. Not just in following him—which is simply succeeding to various degrees in doing he says to do—or coming to an understanding of all that he did and taught before he was taken up, although both of those are worthwhile pursuits. But they are not life in and of themselves.

So, Pastor, where do I go to find Jesus and, therefore, life? Is it in church? In praying to him? In reading his word? In attempting to live in obedience to his word? In sharing the Sacrament of the Altar with the Body of Christ? Is it in fellowship with the Body of

Christ? Yes. To all of them, YES!



Finding Jesus and life is not an activity or even a lifestyle. The best way I can put it is an identity given to us by Christ, the author and giver of life Himself. An identity you have been given and will have forever.




