#### **SUMMERTIME BLUES**

Grilling out, softball season, the end of the school year... the summer is here!

Vacations, barbeques, lazy days at the pool, cutting out early on Friday, and spending long hours with friends and family. Hopefully it means a little less time in front of a screen.

For many, summer is the reward for living nose-to-the-grindstone the rest of the year. With better weather, less stress, and longer days, summer is the weekend of the four seasons.

But this is not necessarily the case for everyone. For some, the expectations of a 5-o'clock-somewhere summer are met with unexpected sadness, loneliness, and even depression. Memories of a lost love hang like the dark clouds of a grey winter sky over everyone else's carefree sweet summertime.

Where am I going with this? Stephen Ministry.

With 15 members of the congregation trained by the Stephen Series and commissioned Stephen Ministers, Zion is ready to stand beside you and walk with you through the hard times you are facing. Deteriorating marriage, the loneliness of a recent empty-nest, the loss of a spouse, the diagnosis of an illness for you or someone you love, or the loss of a job are just some of the normal life circumstances that lead people to ask for a Stephen Minister to provide care.

"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. For if anyone thinks he is something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself." These words of Paul, from Galatians 6, teach us that we Christians are under a solemn obligation to look out for one another and to lend a helping hand and a listening ear. But these words of Paul also teach us that we are under a solemn obligation to acknowledge that, sometimes we are unable to bear up under what comes our way. We think we are strong enough, we think we are "something" when we are weak. We don't ask for the listening ear, and we don't reach out to the helping hand.

If you're going through hard times, please, please consider Paul's words and do not think you are something when you are nothing—don't make things worse by trying to overcome impossible obstacles or difficulties in your own. You have a strong group of Stephen Ministers who have been trained to help you, to listen and to pray. If you would like to learn more, or are considering having a Stephen Minister, please contact Pastor Duncan or Vicar David.

#### **Bathrooms and Food Needed**

40 youth and chaperones will be coming to Zion as part of Faith Lutheran Church's "Kingdoms Kind" Choir Tour. They will be singing for us on Saturday (6/14) during the Creation Seminar (at 5:30pm), during the services on Sunday (6/15) and again Sunday evening (5:00pm). This group will be staying with us through Thursday so that they can serve at local soup kitchens and other Christian service ministries. There's plenty of room for the group in the Fellowship Hall, but there are a couple of things we can do to provide Christian hospitality for our brothers and sisters in Christ. First, they will need homes to shower and clean-up in. And, second, I have put us on the hook for their dinner Saturday, 6/14. So what I am asking from you, dear members of Zion, is to open your homes and, in particular, your bathrooms to this group for as many days as you can. Figure on at most an hour for every day you open your home plus travel time to and from the church. There will be a sign-up sheet at church, or you can contact the church office. If each family takes 4 kids, we will need 9 families to sign-up (we will be taking at least 4 of the group to the parsonage). Also, dinner on Saturday. Nothing over-the-top. Contact me via e-mail or phone, or call the church office if you are willing to help out.

Please plan on coming to hear Kingdoms Kind sing! This Youth Choir has been together for decades and is incredibly talented. You will be blessed to listen and hear them sing songs of praise to God for his love to us in Jesus!



We will be having our first interest meeting June 22<sup>nd</sup> after the late service.


