#### Lions and Tigers and Bears, O My!

But we're not living in the Merry Old Land of Oz and most of us are not from Kansas, and so instead of Lions, Tigers and Bears, we have ISIS, Ebola in America, \$17 Trillion in debt, falling wages, a bourgeoning police state, and the erosion of traditional values. Scary things, right? The kinds of things that keep you up at night while you also wonder if you locked all of the doors, if your kids did all their homework, and if you should set your alarm 30 minutes earlier because tomorrow looks particularly busy. If it's not these things that scare us, there are others lining up to take their place and fill our minds and souls with terror.

The question for us Christians is not: what should I be afraid of? Rather, the questions we should first ask are: is fear virtuous? Is it a fruit of the Spirit? Does fear come from, or does it stand opposed to our faith in Christ? Consider the following Bible passages:

For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, ""Abba," Father." (Romans 8:15)

There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love. (1 John 4:18)

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. (Psalm 23:4)

The LORD is with me; I will not be afraid. What can man do to me? (Psalm 118:6)

For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline. (2 Timothy 1:7)

And maybe one of the questions we should ask second is: if we are to fear anything, shouldn't it be bringing shame to the one who saved us, our Lord Jesus Christ?

Dear Friends, there will always be things that want nothing more than for you to be afraid of them, but they do not have the authority to bring fear into your life. You have been called from a life that is handed mercilessly from one fearful thing to another, to a life rooted in the confidence of forgiveness and resurrection because of Christ; a life without fear—even without fear of death itself.



Our school year is off to another great start. We have the highest number of students enrolled in the history of the school...119! Our classes include 1 Stepping Stones class, 2 PreKindergarten classes, 3 PreSchool classes and 2 Small Steps classes. To accommodate all of these wonderful children, we had to add some new staff members: Amy Kissinger is working in the PreKindergarten class with Mrs. Barb, Karen Vinoverski is working with Mrs. Stacy in the PreKindergarten class, Tersa Peluso is working in the Stepping Stones class with Mrs. Peggy and Amamda Conway, who has been attending our church, is helping out in the Small Steps room. We now have a staff of 17, including me.

September was a month filled with a lot of excitement. We were excited to start a new year, excited to watch the transformation of the classrooms as some were painted and redecorated, excited to get to know our new staff members, excited to meet the new children and their families and excited to start sharing the good news of Jesus Christ to these young souls.

We jumped right in with circle time, craft time, playground time, story time, snack time, Kids Praise and Jesus time. We keep our days filled with activities where the children are learning while having fun. We also had a few tears, especially in the Small Steps and PreSchool classes. For most of these children it is their first time away from mommy or daddy, which can be scary. Our loving staff steps right in and calms their anxious little hearts! I'm proud to say that we are almost a "tear free" school.

We will have our first Chapel in October...The Parable of the Pumpkin. "For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," make His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ." 2 Corinthians 4:6. This lesson uses two jack-o-lanterns, one happy with a lit candle inside and one unhappy, dark pumpkin. The carved pumpkins help to explain the Gospel story in a very "visual" way. The lesson explains the differences between living life with Jesus and living life without Jesus. We will also read "The Pumpkin Patch Parable." It is our prayer that these two activities help to make the Gospel message more clear and meaningful to the children. "When Jesus spoke again to the people, He said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12
