Chairman's Report

Voters Meeting - Outcome

On June 28, 2015 the Voters of Zion approved the 2015/2016 fiscal budget that included:

- Overall budget increased from last years budget by 2%
- Average salary increases of 3.5% for church and school staff
- Support for part-time Youth Minister position
- Increase in school tuition and number of students (127)
- Focus on needed repairs to the church and parsonage
- Trustee projects:
 - Repairing the church roof seams to address minor leaks
 - Energy efficient roof coating as part of the repair
 - Parsonage kitchen improvements and maintenance



We were pleased to present another break-even budget (\$532,137 expense equal \$532,137 revenue) and no major carry-over expenses.

We reduced Weekly Operating Giving - Church, Mission & Synod (CMS) by 9% from last year budget. We increased the preschool budget do to increased student enrollment by 18%. The Preschool continues to grow and is self-funded. The Council will continue to ensure a strong expense control process.

Just a reminder, July and August are the most difficult times for Zion to cover monthly expenses, so we encourage you to remember Zion while you are away on vacation, since our expenses don't go on vacation. Please continue to pray for Zion that we are able to end this new budget year with a positive cash flow.

Notes from the Eastern District Convention

The Eastern District of the Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod held its 98th Regular Convention last June. Pastor Duncan and Lay Representative Jay Anderson represented Zion at the Convention, which was attended by over 170 Pastoral and Lay Delegates, various District Officials and even the President of the Synod, Matthew Harrison.

Several of the highlights include:

- District President Chris Wicher was re-elected on the first ballot.
- Our new Regional Vice President is the former Pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church of the South Hills, Rev. Daniel Strussenberg.
- The motion was approved to swing the balance of control of the District Board of Directors from Clergy to Laity, with 7 Ordained Members and 8 Lay Members.
- President Harrison reported that the number of missionaries the Synod will have in the field will, in several years' time, be at an all-time high! The Synod has also undertaken an ambitious "Wittenberg Project" to renovate an historic building, turning it into a hotel and historical center for those visiting the cite of the start of the Reformation for its 500th Anniversary in 2017. Also, the Lutheran Church in Africa continues its rapid growth. Did you know that Ethiopia alone has almost double the number of Lutherans than the United States?
- What I took away as being "interesting" was that 91% of the Voting Delegates at the Convention were over the age of 40; with 80% being 50 and above. And of the congregations represented, 95% had a weekly worship attendance under 200.

Back to Basics

For 2015 Zion is going Back to Basics! We're spending time on Sunday morning going over the basic truths of the Christian Faith. We started with the 10 Commandments and are generally be following the outline of Luther's Small Catechism. If you miss a week here or there, recordings of the sermons are available on our website (zlcb.org). Also, at our Wednesday Evening Service of Prayer and Preaching, we take what we looked at on Sunday and take it a little bit more in depth. We also answer the questions that are asked on Sunday... or try to answer them as best we can at our Wednesday Evening Service of Prayer and Preaching. We hope you can join us for worship!



Earlier this year, we did a survey to determine whether there was any interest in Zion offering Online Giving. Based on the survey results we have decide to begin offering an electronic option for those members who would like to use this service.

Therefore, we are pleased to announce the introduction of an electronic option for making regular and special offerings. Contributions can now be transferred automatically from your checking or savings account. The secured service provider is Vanco Payment Service, which is used by most LCMS churches throughout the country. As you know weekly offerings can fluctuate significantly from week to week due to vacation, travel, illness and other circumstances, but when contributions are automated there tends to be less fluctuation in giving throughout the year.
