Welcome to worship!

This morning, our Back to Basics Series moves ahead as we take a look at the Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer: "thy will be done." Or, more accurately, "thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." This is when you expect your pastor to ask: "what is God's will?" (And, don't worry, we'll get to this in the sermon.) But you are an intelligent bunch of people and so let's ask the more challenging question: if God is sovereign and all powerful, why do we have to ask for him to do what he wants, isn't he doing it already? In the words of Luther: "The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also." In other words, we are praying that God would have his way with us; we are submitting to his rule and authority when we pray this prayer. This is a gutsy petition to pray. We are relinquishing control of our lives and handing it over to the one who created us; we are submitting to God. We are echoing what Jesus prayed in Gethsemane: "Not my will but thine be done."

The question for us this morning then becomes: is this a smart thing to ask God to do? Do we really want God's will and not our own to be done in our lives? Would we rather ask God to bless us and then leave us alone, free to do as we will and desire? Do we really want to give God the keys to our life and say, "take her for a spin?"

I hope that you will see during our time together in worship that asking for God's will to be done in our lives neither an easy thing to do nor is it an easy thing to live with, but it is the right thing to ask for and a good thing (a VERY good thing) to live with.

The Old Testament Reading: Micah 6:6-8

With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of olive oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

The New Testament Reading: Romans 12:1-8

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

Pastor: In honor of our Lord Jesus Christ, we rise for the reading of the

Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 22nd Chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel Reading: Luke 22: 39-46

Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and his disciples followed him. On reaching the place, he said to them, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation." He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground.

When he rose from prayer and went back to the disciples, he found them asleep, exhausted from sorrow. "Why are you sleeping?" he asked them. "Get up and pray so that you will not fall into temptation."

The Service of the Sacrament

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took

bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in

remembrance of Me."

Pastor: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim

the Lord's death until He comes.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

People: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy

kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
