

Welcome to worship!

Last Sunday, we took a look at one of my favorite Parables: the Prodigal Son. We saw the love of the father for his two children and applied it to our relationship with God. We saw how the mistakes of our past (and present) do not prevent us from coming to our heavenly Father and receiving his forgiveness through Jesus Christ. Well, this evening we pick up where we left off as we continue to dig deeper into our understanding of the 5th Petition of the Lord's Prayer ("forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us"). And, just like we did on Sunday, we are going to turn to another one of Jesus' parables to guide us.

The parable we are going to look at this evening is the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. In it we will see the imperative invitation Jesus gives his disciples to ask God to forgive them, and gives them the assurance that their prayers will be heard and answered. And, just for fun, we'll take a look at the greater context of this parable (specifically, the Parable of the Persistent Widow) that came before it and see that we have one who advocates on our behalf to our heavenly father without fail.

We've got a lot to cover in our time together this evening!

And, since this is the last Wednesday of the month, we will also be celebrating Holy Communion!
