

Welcome to worship!

This evening, as to do so often in Midweek Service of Prayer and Preaching, we are going to take a closer look at the theme from last Sunday, the Sixth Petition of the Lord's Prayer: "lead us not into temptation." We are going to take a look at a story from the book of Genesis about a young man named Joseph and his struggle to resist temptation (as well as what it cost him when he did).

It is all but impossible to go through the day and not be led into temptation by what we see and hear. One of the temptations that is most frequently experienced in our culture is the temptation to commit sexual sin. Fornication, sodomy, adultery and lust are all celebrated by a culture that seems to think human sexuality was invented in the 1960's, and not a part of God's original plan and design for man and woman "from the beginning."

Sadly, many lives have been torn apart and families destroyed by sexual sin of one kind or another. Even children (maybe even especially children) have borne the brunt of the consequences of the bad decisions of their sexually deviant parents.

In our Scripture lesson this evening, we will see the lengths we are to go to resist the urge to sin sexually. Sold into slavery, Joseph had every reason to give into temptation and love his master Potiphar's wife. Giving into her pleas for attention would have let him be seen as the head of the household in the eyes of his fellow servants; she could have even set him free. But he chooses righteousness over sin and obedience over lust. There's a lot we can learn from the example of Joseph, but even more from the example of Jesus who, in every way, was without sin.

The Reading: Genesis 39:1-23

Now Joseph had been brought down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, had bought him

from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. The Lord was with Joseph, and he became a successful man, and he was in the house of his Egyptian master. His master saw that the Lord was with him and that the Lord caused all that he did to succeed in his hands. So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had. From the time that he made him overseer in his house and over all that he had, the Lord blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; the blessing of the Lord was on all that he had, in house and field. So he left all that he had in Joseph's charge, and because of him he had no concern about anything but the food he ate.

Now Joseph was handsome in form and appearance. And after a time his master's wife cast her eyes on Joseph and said, "Lie with me." But he refused and said to his master's wife, "Behold, because of me my master has no concern about anything in the house, and he has put everything that he has in my charge. He is not greater in this house than I am, nor has he kept back anything from me except you, because you are his wife. How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" And as she spoke to Joseph day after day, he would not listen to her, to lie beside her or to be with her.

But one day, when he went into the house to do his work and none of the men of the house was there in the house, she caught him by his garment, saying, "Lie with me." But he left his garment in her hand and fled and got out of the house. And as soon as she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and had fled out of the house, she called to the men of her household and said to them, "See, he has brought among us a Hebrew to laugh at us. He came in to me to lie with me, and I cried out with a loud voice. And as soon as he heard that I lifted up my voice and cried out, he left his garment be side me and fled and got out of the house." Then she laid up his garment by her until his master

came home, and she told him the same story, saying, "The Hebrew servant, whom you have brought among us, came in to me to laugh at me. But as soon as lifted up my voice and cried, he left his garment beside me and fled out of the house."

As soon as his master heard the words that his wife spoke to him, "This is the way your servant treated me," his anger was kindled. And Joseph's master took him and put him into the prison, the place where the king's prisoners were confined, and he was there in prison. But the Lord was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love and gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison. And the keeper of the prison put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners who were in the prison. Whatever was done there, he was the one who did it. The keeper of the prison paid no attention to anything that was in Joseph's charge, because the Lord was with him. And whatever he did, the Lord made it succeed.
