

Welcome to worship!

This evening, we are going to be doing a couple of things. The Sunday before last, a question was asked why Jesus doesn't want his disciples telling people who he really is (until after his resurrection). This issue, known as the "Messianic Secret" is unique to the Gospel of Mark. Scholars and theologians are not shy in suggesting answers. Some are good. Some are not. We will wade through some of the suggested reasons for why Mark draws attention to the "Messianic Secret" and what it means for us. Why would Jesus tell people not to tell people who he is, when we have been told by him to teach all the nations everything he has given to us?

But that's not all we'll be doing. We are also going to wrap up our study on the Lord's Prayer, taking a look at how Christ has delivered us from evil, and how he uses us to deliver other people from evil (and the evil one). And, wouldn't you know it, it is here that the "Messianic Secret" and our calling as Christians intersects in some significant and powerful ways. But if I said anymore here, I'd say too much; I want to save the good stuff for the message!

We've got a lot going on this evening at our Midweek Service of Prayer and Preaching. Thank you for being here, and don't forget to sign up for the Romans Study, coming in three short weeks!
