Welcome to worship!

This evening, our Midweek Series on Baptism continues as we take a look at Philip and the Ethiopian Eunuch. Last week, we took a look at Philip and Simon the Magician. We saw how this man, having come to faith and receiving the gift of Baptism, abandoned Christ and received a strong rebuke from Peter and John. You would think that this would have been a setback for Philip; that he would have been reluctant to speak the name of Jesus again, seeing what happened to Simon the Magician. But this is not the case! Philip doesn't skip a beat and gets right back to speaking the name of Jesus to anyone who will listen, even a Eunuch from Ethiopia!

There's a lot we can take away from Philip's tenacity, steadfastness and faithfulness. His is a wonderfully human example of the joys we can have in sharing the gospel, as well as the realistic setbacks that sometimes happen. Sometimes people respond favorably to the Gospel; sometimes they do not. But this should not deter us from doing all that we can to do the Great Commission: baptizing and teaching all nations; sharing with all people (even Samaritan Sorcerers or Magicians and Ethiopian Eunuchs) the best news they will ever hear, the good news of Jesus!

The Reading: Acts 8:26-40

Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is a desert place. And he

rose and went. And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official of Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, who was in charge of all her treasure. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning, seated in his chariot, and he was reading the prophet Isaiah. And the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹ And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth.

In his humiliation justice was denied him.

Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth."

And the eunuch said to Philip, "About whom, I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning with this Scripture he told him the good news about Jesus. And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" And he commanded the chariot to stop, and they both went down into the water, Philip and the eunuch, and he baptized him. And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away, and the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he passed through he preached the gospel to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.
