Welcome to Worship!

This morning, our four-week series on Baptism continues as we take a look at what is probably the most controversial aspect of Baptism: who it is for. Last week, we saw that God connects us to Christ through Baptism in such a way that we receive all the gifts Christ earned for us with his sinless life, atoning death and all-conquering resurrection: forgiveness of sins, the gift of the Holy Spirit, a resurrection like his, and being clothed in Him. In the words of St. Peter, the result of Baptism is that we are saved through the resurrection of Christ.

But who is Baptism for? Is it for adults and infants? Is it for people whose parents are members of a particular denomination? Is it for people who want to make a public display of a personal faith? Who is Baptism for?

In our "Rookie Mistake" segment last week, we took a look at the difference between descriptive and prescriptive passages in Scripture. This week, we will see how people who take descriptive passages prescriptively end up fencing-off baptism for most people. I hope that you will see the only restriction placed on baptism is on the people who are baptizing: that they are only to baptize people who have been taught the Christian faith, or who will be taught the Christian faith. Other than that one restriction, I hope you will see how Scripture uses words like "all" and "every" when describing who receives God's gift of Baptism.

If you have not been baptized and would like to know more about "how it's done," please talk with me after the service, e-mail or call me during the week. I'd love to tell you more about Baptism and why it is a good thing for you, for your children and all whom the Lord our God calls to himself! God bless your time in worship!

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Jeremiah 1:1-8

The words of Jeremiah, the son of Milkiah, one of the priests who were in Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, to whom the word of the Lord came in the days of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah, in the thirteenth year of his reign. It came also in the days of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, and until the end of the eleventh year of Zedekiah, the son of Josiah, king of Judah, until the captivity of Jerusalem in the fifth month. Now the word of the Lord came to me, saying, "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations." Then I said, "Ah, Lord God! Behold, I do not know how to speak, for I am only a youth." But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a youth'; for to all to whom I send you, you shall go, and whatever I command

you, you shall speak. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declares the Lord."

The New Testament Reading: Acts 16:25-34

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them, and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken. And immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bonds were unfastened. When the jailer woke and saw that the prison doors were open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, supposing that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul cried with a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." And the jailer called for lights and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." And they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was baptized at once, he and all his family. Then he brought them up into his house and set food before them. And he rejoiced along with his entire household that he had believed in God.

The Service of the Sacrament

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took

bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in

remembrance of Me."

Pastor: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim

the Lord's death until He comes.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

People: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy

kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
