

This evening we are beginning our Midweek Study of the book of Romans. I'll say it as plainly as I can: there is no other book in the Bible that more clearly teaches the Gospel than Romans. In his letter to the Christians in Rome, Paul lays out what the problem people have is (sin), what it results in (death), what God has done about it (sent Jesus to keep the Law, die in our place on the cross, and conquer death in his resurrection), what this means for us (salvation by grace through faith), and how we should live as a result (serve God).

Tonight, I want to give you a few introductory remarks about the book and get you ready for some general discussion questions for your time in small groups following the service. If you did not order a Romans study book, don't worry! We can get you one and you're more than able to join one of the small groups.

I am looking forward to this study and out time together in small groups. This is the first time we've done something like this (coordinating a worship service with small group discussion), so please bear with us as we work out any first-time kinks that develop.

God bless your time in worship (and Small Group!) as we begin our study on the foremost of the Epistles and the cornerstone of the Gospel.
