Welcome to worship!

This evening, we begin our Midweek Series on the "Advents of Christ." We begin this evening by taking a look at Christ's first advent, the events leading up to his birth from the Gospel of Luke. Come back next week as we take a look at Christ's second advent, the events leading up to his coming at the end of the age. Two weeks from today, we will take a look at how you experience an advent in your life when Christ comes to you. And for our last midweek service in Advent, we will take a look at how Christ comes into the world today (and what he does when he comes).

Christ's first coming is what we celebrate at Christmas. That God, when the time had fully come, took on a human nature and became like us in every way (except without sin) in order to do what we could not do, fulfill God's Law and therefore provide a means of salvation for all people. We celebrate and remember when God acted decisively in history to do something to rescue and save people, originally made in his image and likeness, who had been so corrupted by sin as to have become totally depraved. As we look back to the events surrounding the birth of Christ, we cannot help but ponder and marvel at what his first coming means for us; that we are not abandoned by God as if he was some clockmaker who set the course of the planets and galaxies and watches from a distance as things unfold, but that he is personally and passionately involved with the events of history and the lives of people like you and me.

And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.
