#### Chairman's Report

This past year a small group of individuals reviewed, modified, added and removed text from the Constitution and Bylaw's of Zion. These changes are being made to ensure that the Constitution and Bylaw's align with the existing church practices, processes and to clean up some typing errors.

<a href="www.zlcb.org/">constitution</a>. We have password protected the document, since this page is intended solely for the use of members of Zion Lutheran Church. In order to change the Constitution and Bylaws we must adhere the: **Power to amend this Constitution** and establish Bylaws.

- 1. The voters may adopt such Bylaws as may be required for the accomplishment of its purpose.
- 2. Article III (Doctrinal Standard) of the Constitution shall be unalterable and irrepealable. The remainder of the Constitution may be amended at a regular meeting of the Voters' Assembly, provided:
  - a. They do not conflict with the provisions laid down in Article III.
  - b. The proposed amendment(s) have been submitted in writing at the previous meeting of the Voters.
  - c. An affirmative vote of a two-thirds majority of the voting members present is received.

We plan to discuss the changes at the January 24 voters meeting. Please take the time to review the document prior to the meeting. If you have any suggestions or corrections, please email <a href="mailto:bobschmidt47@gmail.com">bobschmidt47@gmail.com</a> or contact me.


