Welcome to worship!

Knowing your place on the food chain. When you don't know where you stand or where you line up, it's easy to embarrass yourself (at best), make a fatal mistake (at worst), or anything in between.

Knowing your place on the food chain. When a 92 Civic DX with a tin can hanging out the back thinks he can keep up with something labeled 5.0GT, SS, or SRT 392, someone doesn't know their place on the food chain. When a scrawny freshman tries to impress the senior Offensive Tackle in the weight room, someone doesn't know their place on the food chain. And when that same freshman takes it upon himself to correct his overly self-assured Ph.D Professor in his Introduction to General Education class at Second Chance University, he still doesn't know his place on the food chain.

This morning, we are going to take a look at a story from the book of Numbers that shows how far the Israelites were from knowing their place on the food chain. After God came to them, gave them the Law, the Priesthood, the Tabernacle, the Ceremonial Law that governed their relationship with him, and after he promised to be with them and bless them if only they kept his statutes and commands, they complain. Life is hard. They deserve more from God. Spoiled-child kind of complaining. They forgot that they were sinners in need of a Savior, sojourners in the wilderness who relied on God's daily provision of manna and quail to simply survive, rescued slaves from Egypt who owed their freedom to the mercy and grace of God.

We will also take a look at a parallel text from the Gospel of Luke, where Jesus teaches his disciples where they land on the "food chain." Both are humbling texts, but ones that highlight the undeserved mercy and charity of God.

Confession of Sins

Pastor: This morning, the text for our consideration from the book of Numbers tells about a time when the Israelites grumbled against the Lord. Even though He was providing manna and quail for them; and even though He had given instructions for the tabernacle and the priesthood, laws concerning sacrifices and holiness, and established the feast days for His people, they did not believe He was treating them fairly. They wanted more than they deserved and were ungrateful for what they had been given. In the same way, we have been ungrateful recipients of God's grace and generosity. We have deluded ourselves into thinking we deserve material and spiritual blessings greater than those of any who have come before us. But the reality is, because of our sin, we deserve nothing but divine punishment and wrath. Let us therefore confess our sins to God, trusting in His mercy through our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

People: Almighty God, we confess that we have been prideful and arrogant, ungrateful and greedy. We think too highly of ourselves, but fail to consider your righteousness and justice. We behave like spoiled children to you. Have mercy on us. Give us truly repentant hearts, a humble spirit, and faith to see your

generous provision for all our needs. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Old Testament Reading: Numbers 14:1-12

Then all the congregation raised a loud cry, and the people wept that night. And all the people of Israel grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The whole congregation said to them, "Would that we had died in the land of Egypt! Or would that we had died in this wilderness! Why is the Lord bringing us into this land, to fall by the sword? Our wives and our little ones will become a prey. Would it not be better for us to go back to Egypt?" And they said to one another, "Let us choose a leader and go back to Egypt."

Then Moses and Aaron fell on their faces before all the assembly of the congregation of the people of Israel. And Joshua the son of Nun and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had spied out the land, tore their clothes and said to all the congregation of the people of Israel, "The land, which we passed through to spy it out, is an exceedingly good land. If the Lord delights in us, he will bring us into this land and give it to us, a land that flows with milk and honey. Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not fear the people of the land, for they are bread for us. Their protection is removed from them, and the Lord is with us; do not fear them." Then all the congregation said to stone them with stones. But the glory of the Lord appeared at the tent of meeting to all the people of Israel.

And the Lord said to Moses, "How long will this people despise me? And how long will they not believe in me, in spite of all the signs that I have done among them? I will strike them with the pestilence and disinherit them, and I will make of you a nation greater and mightier than they."

Does he thank the servant because he did what was commanded? So you also, when you have done all that you were commanded, say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done what was our duty."

And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
