Third Midweek Lent March 2nd, 2016

Welcome to worship!

This evening, our study of the week leading up to Jesus' crucifixion continues as we take a look at three questions the religious establishment in Jerusalem asks Jesus and the one question Jesus asks them in return.

Pharisees and Sadducees alike questioned Jesus' faith and actions. Claiming at one point that the works he did pointed to demon possession, they now try to trip Jesus up in what he believes about things like taxes, marriage and the resurrection, and what the greatest commandment is. Now, as you expect, it is easy for Jesus to answer their questions—he is all-knowing—and to turn the tables on his accusers by asking them a question for which they have no answer.

As followers of Jesus, we also get questioned by the Pharisees and Sadducees of our day—people whose contradictory convictions are strengthened when they take us down a notch, people who are threatened by our faith in the resurrection of the Son of God, the forgiveness of sins, and belief in a sovereign, loving deity. But unlike Jesus, we do not have access to the storehouse of God's infinite wisdom when we are questioned. So, Church, what do we do when our faith is questioned (at best) or attacked (at worse)? What do we say? How do we respond?

This evening we will take a look at how Jesus responded to challenges to his faith as we look at ways to defend ours.

The Gospel Reading: Matthew 22:15-46

Then the Pharisees went and plotted how to entangle him in his words. And they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are true and teach the way of God truthfully, and you do not care about anyone's opinion, for you are not swayed by appearances. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why put me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. And Jesus said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription

is this?" They said, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." When they heard it, they marveled. And they left him and went away.

The same day Sadducees came to him, who say that there is no resurrection, and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses said, 'If a man dies having no children, his brother must marry the widow and raise up offspring for his brother.' Now there were seven brothers among us. The first married and died, and having no offspring left his wife to his brother. So too the second and third, down to the seventh. After them all, the woman died. In the resurrection, therefore, of the seven, whose wife will she be? For they all had her."

But Jesus answered them, "You are wrong, because you know neither the Scriptures nor the power of God. For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. And as for the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was said to you by God: 'I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is not God of the dead, but of the living." And when the crowd heard it, they were astonished at his teaching.

But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them a question, saying, "What do you think about the Christ? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David, in the Spirit, calls him Lord, saying,

"The Lord said to my Lord,

"Sit at my right hand,

until | put your enemies under your feet"?

If then David calls him Lord, how is he his son?" And no one was able to answer him a word, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.
