# Welcome to worship!

Our study of the week of Jesus' life leading up to his crucifixion from the Gospel of Matthew continues as we take a look at Jesus' second longest sermon, Matthew 24-25. In this sermon, Jesus predicts the destruction of Jerusalem and the salvation and judgment of the world. He paints powerful pictures with apocalyptic language and parables as he connects the destruction of Jerusalem to the Final Judgment, and the Final Judgment to the Day of Eschatological Salvation.

There's a lot going on in our text this evening, so we are going to have to be careful where we spend our time. They say if you give a man a fish, you feed him for a day; but if you teach him to fish, you feed him for a lifetime. This evening, it is my goal to teach you how to fish through the difficult text of Matthew 24-25. We will not cover everything; but I hope that, by the time we are done this evening, you will have the tools to make sense of this intriguing, chilling and comforting text.

Looking ahead to next week, we will have service on Wednesday (as we wrap-up our series, taking a look at the events leading up to the Last Supper), Thursday (as we remember the institution of the Lord's Supper), Friday (a Tenebrae Service), and Easter Sunday (where we celebrate the all-conquering resurrection of the Son of God). ## The Gospel Reading: Matthew 24:1-14

Jesus left the temple and was going away, when his disciples came to point out to him the buildings of the temple. But he answered them, "You see all these, do you not? Truly, I say to you, there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down."

As he sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?" And Jesus answered them, "See that no one leads you astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and they will lead many astray. And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not alarmed, for this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are but the beginning of the birth pains.

"Then they will deliver you up to tribulation and put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations for my name's sake. And then many will fall away and betray one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come.
