Christ Is Risen!

It is still dark when two women from small towns hundreds of miles away in Galilee leave their rented rooms in Jerusalem and head out into the strange streets of Israel's capital city to visit the tomb of the man who, two days earlier, they believed was the Messiah. They make it to the tomb in time to see an angel easily roll away the stone that had been set as Caesar's seal. The sixteen trained Roman soldiers also prove no match for the heaven sent messenger. But to the women who had come seeking Jesus, he shows tender grace, proclaiming that Jesus has risen from the dead, but allowing the women to examine the tomb just to make sure it is as he said. And despite being told not to fear, the women departed quickly from the tomb with fear. But they also departed with "great joy" (according to the text of the Gospel of Matthew); and they did

so quickly in order to tell the disciples that Jesus had risen from the dead.

Fear and great joy. I don't know how I would react to history's first (and only) resurrection. Yes, Scripture records other people were brought back from the dead, but to their original state and only for a time. This is the first (and only) time in history a person was brought back to life in a glorified body incapable of decay; unable to die again. Maybe I would react with fear and great joy. Maybe I would stand at the mouth of the tomb with my jaw wide open. I don't know. But the first witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus responded with fear and great joy.

But why fear? The Gospel of Mark also records that the women left the empty tomb of Jesus with fear. Why? Maybe it was because the sight of an angel powerful enough to roll away the stone and make well-trained soldiers become like dead men is unavoidably scary. Maybe. But why do Matthew and Mark find it necessary to record this emotional response to the angel; how does it help them advance their Gospel? I think the women are afraid because they know that with the resurrection of the dead comes the end of the age. This also explains why they quickly went and told the disciples that Jesus had risen from the dead. Time is short.

And what of great joy? If the women believed the end of the age had been ushered in through the resurrection of Jesus, why would they leave the tomb with great joy? Life as they knew it had changed! They could not go back to the lives they once had; the familiar First-Century Jewish lens through which the saw and understood the world had been swapped out for something different. They were the first ones to receive the thing that the Old Testament Prophets foresaw, that had been promised to Adam and Eve in the garden, and on which the fate of the souls of all people rested. They understood that the resurrection of Jesus had already radically changed their lives. And this gave them great joy.

But, coming off the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus, what is this to you? There are two ways to respond to Christ being raised from the dead. Either you can try to fit the resurrection in with your life as you know it, or you can let the resurrection do its work and transform your life. You will find that, if you try to fit the resurrection into your life as you know it, you will have your work cut out for you. The defeat of death, the forgiveness of sins and the reconciling of God with mankind does not react well to being told to take a back seat to whatever came before it. The alternative is the course taken by the women at

the tomb, the disciples of Jesus, the crowd at Pentecost, and the millions and millions of people who have heard the Gospel of Christ and reoriented their lives around the truth revealed by an empty tomb. It is the course marked out for you when you were baptized, and the direction of the continual pull by the Holy Spirit in your life. It is to consider everything other than Christ rubbish and to live unapologetically as if death has been defeated, sins are forgiven, and God and man have been reconciled because it has been, they are, and we have been.

With fear and great joy: Christ is risen indeed!

Hey Zion!

We've been given a tremendous opportunity to serve our sister congregations, encourage the faith of our extended church family, and even reach the greater Pittsburgh Community with the Gospel, but we need your help. The Pittsburgh Lutheran is looking for new editors.

What is the Pittsburgh Lutheran? The Pittsburgh Lutheran is produced by PALM (Pittsburgh Area Lutheran Ministries) to inform the LCMS congregations in Pittsburgh what the other LCMS congregations in Pittsburgh are doing. It is a monthly publication.

What do the editors do? Three things. First, they send out monthly e-mails to the LCMS congregations, reminding them when their articles are due. When articles arrive (via e-mail), they arrange and format the articles to fit into the newsletter template. And lastly, they send the finished product to the printer who copies and distributes the magazine. In all, it takes about 8 hours per month.

What are we looking for? A team of Zion volunteers to take on the project. You would not personally be responsible for everything, but would work with a team to get it done, improve the product over time, and be part of an effort to inform and encourage our brothers and sisters in Christ who belong to sister congregations in the Pittsburgh area.

Do I need to be a professional journalist, writer or editor? No. Anyone who can send e-mail and be willing to be trained to learn the software that formats the magazine, who has a heart for outreach and mission, and who has a desire to serve would be a valuable team member.

What is the commitment? The total time it takes to gather, edit and arrange is 8 hours. Depending on the size and ability of the team, an individual's responsibilities could be very minimal (sending out an e-mail). We are not asking for a large commitment; ideally we will have a team that can spread the work around.







The goal for this year is to create another performing group that is accessible for just about anyone....Bell Choir! Musical talent/experience is not required to participate in this group. However, we need to purchase the bells before we start recruiting "ringers". The approximate cost for a standard 3 octave set of bells is \$12,000 which includes not only the bells themselves, but protective cases, performance tables, foam mats, music stands, gloves, polishing materials, and music. Whew!

Last October church council established a bell choir account for anyone that would like to contribute to this area of the music ministry. If you would like to give to this ministry, please make a note on your check or offering envelope that you wish to give to the bell choir account. We are also providing an opportunity for members to "buy a bell" in honor or memory of loved ones or your family. The price for the "buy a bell program" is \$325 per bell. 


