

### Welcome to worship!

This morning our focus is on 2 Samuel 9, and the story of David and Mephibosheth. This story is largely unknown, but is, in my opinion, the most powerful picture of the gospel in the entire Old Testament. In it, the newly crowned King David does the unthinkable; he goes out of his way to show kindness to the only remaining descendant of the recently deposed King Saul's house. Mephibosheth is the only surviving member of Saul's household. He was living in no-man's land and was crippled in both feet. But David brings him into his palace, promises him all that belonged to Saul, invites him to eat from his table, and gave him a full cadre of servants to tent to his daily needs.

But before David gives a thing to Mephibosheth, he tells him that he is going to show Mephibosheth God's kindness. He speaks to the grandson of Saul and tell him that what he is going to do is an object lesson on the grace, mercy and love of God; David tells Mephibosheth that he wants to show him "God's kindness." David shows Mephibosheth and the reader of 2 Samuel 9 (you and me) that God's kindness is total and complete, it does not cut corners or ask for anything in return. It finds its ultimate expression when Jesus bled and died on the cross for you and for me. Here, in 2 Samuel 9, it is foreshadowed.

I hope that this text will lay to rest in your minds any notion that there is something you need to do to earn God's favor, or that there is anything you can do to add to what Christ has done for you in his death and resurrection. I hope that this text will show you beyond a shadow of a doubt that your heavenly Father loves you and that his love lacks nothing.

Tomorrow our nation celebrates the anniversary of our independence from England. As Christians, this text helps us remember that God's kindness has set us free from being controlled by the devil, the world and our own sinful flesh.

#### Psalm of the Day: Psalm 33:13-22

The Lord looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man; from where he sits enthroned he looks out on all the inhabitants of the earth, he who fashions the hearts of them all and observes all their deeds.

The war horse is a false hope for salvation, and by its great might it cannot rescue.

Behold, the eye of the Lord is on those who fear him, on those who hope in his steadfast love, that he may deliver their soul from death and keep them alive in famine.

Our soul waits for the Lord; he is our help and our shield.

For our heart is glad in him, because we trust in his holy name.

Let your steadfast love, O Lord, be upon us, even as we hope in you.

#### **Old Testament Reading:**

2 Samuel 9

And David said, "Is there still anyone left of the house of Saul, that I may show him kindness for Jonathan's sake?" Now there was a servant of the house of Saul whose name was Ziba, and they called him to David. And the king said to

him, "Are you Ziba?" And he said, "I am your servant." And the king said, "Is there not still someone of the house of Saul, that I may show the kindness of God to him?" Ziba said to the king, "There is still a son of Jonathan; he is crippled in his feet." The king said to him, "Where is he?" And Ziba said to the king, "He is in the house of Machir the son of Ammiel, at Lo-debar." Then King David sent and brought him from the house of Machir the son of Ammiel, at Lo-debar. And Mephibosheth the son of Jonathan, son of Saul, came to David and fell on his face and paid homage. And David said, "Mephibosheth!" And he answered, "Behold, I am your servant." And David said to him, "Do not fear, for I will show you kindness for the sake of your father Jonathan, and I will restore to you all the land of Saul your father, and you shall eat at my table always." And he paid homage and said, "What is your servant, that you should show regard for a dead dog such as I?"

Then the king called Ziba, Saul's servant, and said to him, "All that belonged to Saul and to all his house I have given to your master's grandson. And you and your sons and your servants shall till the land for him and shall bring in the produce, that your master's grandson may have bread to eat. But Mephibosheth your master's grandson shall always eat at my table." Now Ziba had fifteen sons and twenty servants. Then Ziba said to the king, "According to all that my lord the king commands his servant, so will your servant do." So Mephibosheth ate at David's table, like one of the king's sons. And Mephibosheth had a young son, whose name was Mica. And all who lived in Ziba's house became Mephibosheth's servants. So Mephibosheth lived in Jerusalem, for he ate always at the king's table. Now he was lame in both his feet.

Leader: In honor of our Lord Jesus Christ, we rise for the reading of the

Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 5<sup>th</sup> Chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

#### **Gospel Reading:**

John 5:1-17

After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Aramaic called Bethesda, which has five roofed colonnades. In these lay a multitude of invalids—blind, lame, and paralyzed. One man was there who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had already been there a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be healed?" The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, and while I am going another steps down before me." Jesus said to him, "Get up, take up your bed, and walk." And at once the man was healed, and he took up his bed and walked.

Now that day was the Sabbath. So the Jews said to the man who had been healed, "It is the Sabbath, and it is not lawful for you to take up your bed." But he answered them, "The man who healed me, that man said to me, 'Take up your bed, and walk." They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. Afterward Jesus found him in the temple and said to him, "See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse may happen to you." The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him. And this was why the Jews were persecuting Jesus, because he was doing these things on the Sabbath. But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I am working."
