

Welcome to worship!

Do we give God the credit he is due for creation? Probably not. It has been a long time since I have prayed and thanked God for creating my lungs to keep me breathing at night or for my immune system keeping me free from disease. For me, part of the reason why I don't thank God as often as I should (the chief reason being that I am a sinner) is because I don't understand everything that is keeping my body going. Mr. Dennis Wert gave a fantastic presentation at the Genesis Seminar several weeks ago on the complexity of the cell and how the intricacies of the different bodies within the cell stand as evidence against evolution and for our creator God. During his presentation I was learning about processes that I had no idea existed, microscopic processes that are sustaining my body even as I type this sentence.

Even scientists who understand the cell still are unable to control it. The scourge of cancer, a malfunction in a group of cells, has taken us by storm and has had the scientific community in a search for a cure. Even with the things we think we understand like the cell, in many cases we aren't able to create, control, or cure them.

God uses many examples in his answer to Job in our text today. Job hasn't laid the foundation of the earth. He hasn't commanded the morning. He doesn't understand the size of the earth or any of its great riches. He can't possibly grasp any of the wonders of creation. So how can he question the justice of the one who created them? He can't. Job realizes his error and repents before the Lord. He can't explain the things he sees, so he will leave explanation of his suffering to God as well. But what if the "righteous sufferer" CAN explain all those things? What if he is the one by whom all things were made? We'll explore that in the sermon this morning.

The Service of the Word

Old Testament Reading: Job 38: 1-18

Then the | ord answered Job out of the whirlwind and said: "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to me. "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? "Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb, when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band, and prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors, and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed'? "Have you commanded the morning since your days began, and caused the dawn to know its place, that it might take hold of the skirts of the earth, and the wicked be shaken out of it? It is changed like clay under the seal, and its features stand out like a garment. From the wicked their light is withheld, and their uplifted arm is broken.

"Have you entered into the springs of the sea, or walked in the recesses of the deep? Have the gates of death been revealed to you, or have you seen the gates of deep darkness? Have you comprehended the expanse of the earth? Declare, if you know all this.

Epistle Reading: 1 Corinthians 8:1-6

Now concerning food offered to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." This "knowledge" puffs up, but love builds up. If anyone imagines that he knows something, he does not yet know as he ought to know. But if anyone loves God, he is known by God.

Therefore, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "an idol has no real existence," and that "there is no God but one." For although there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as indeed there are many "gods" and many "lords"—yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 23rd Chapter.

Now when the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God, saying, "Certainly this man was innocent!" And all the crowds

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

• We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.

- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood,... this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
