

Welcome to worship!

Welcome to worship!

In our text today, we deal with the account of Zacchaeus. Often times this part of the biblical narrative is treated as a children's story. The interaction of most Christians with this account likely does not go much further than the song about the "wee little man". But this account has great importance beyond the stature of this man, telling us important things about the work of our Savior, Jesus. Theologian Martin Franzmann (brilliant Christian thinker. check him out!) called Luke 19:1-10 a "concentrated" form of the ministry of Jesus. Jesus is about to enter into Jerusalem, passion week is about to begin, but before he goes to die for the sins of the world he stops in Jericho to bring salvation to the house of a chief tax collector.

In this account we have many familiar themes. The crowds love Jesus to the point where Zacchaeus cannot see him without climbing into a tree. Jesus continues to eat at the tables of sinners, here the CHIEF tax collector (the only chief tax collector in the new testament). When Jesus comes he brings eternal salvation. Jesus again calls himself the Son of Man. Salvation in Christ is a fulfillment of the Old Testament, the greatest fulfillment of the promises made to Abraham. This text brings us familiar themes that encapsulate the ministry of Jesus on earth. We have much to learn as we explore the text together today.

We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing. Therefore we ourselves boast about you in the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith in all your persecutions and in the afflictions that you are enduring.

This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be considered worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are also suffering—since indeed God considers it just to repay with affliction those who afflict you, and to grant relief to you who are afflicted as well as to us, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in flaming fire, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus.
