Welcome to worship!

What is repentance? We can talk about it in theory rather easily. We can look at the original meaning of the Greek and Hebrew words. We can look at Biblical examples of repentance. All of these are good things, and we will consider some of them in the service this evening. But for a moment consider these two passages from Scripture.

The first is a narrative account from a parable of Christ in Matthew 21: "A man had two sons. And he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' And he answered, 'I will not,' but afterward he changed his mind and went."

The second is from our reading tonight, Psalm 102:

"My heart is struck down like grass and has withered;

I forget to eat my bread.

Because of my loud groaning my bones cling to my flesh."

Both of these are about repentance. In the narrative it is simple "he changed his mind". We can learn of repentance from this verse.But the Psalm is also helpful, giving unique insight to the experience of one man, the emotional experience of one who is sorry for his sin and turns to God.

For the Lord builds up Zion; he appears in his glory;

he regards the prayer of the destitute and does not despise their prayer.

Let this be recorded for a generation to come, so that a people yet to be created may praise the Lord:

that he looked down from his holy height; from heaven the Lord looked at the earth,

to hear the groans of the prisoners,
to set free those who were doomed to die,
that they may declare in Zion the name of the Lord,

and in Jerusalem his praise,
when peoples gather together,
and kingdoms, to worship the Lord.
He has broken my strength in midcourse;
he has shortened my days.
"O my God," | say, "take me not away
in the midst of my days—
you whose years endure
throughout all generations!"
Of old you laid the foundation of the earth,
