## Welcome to worship!

We've been pouring through the Psalms together for 7 weeks. I hope that you've seen the many different situations addressed by the Psalms. I hope you've seen the deep, real, human emotion expressed by people in real situations. I hope you've seen how even in times of trouble the authors of these Psalms relied on God to deliver them and turned to Him in faith even as earthly trouble came upon them. Most of all, I hope you've learned about Jesus, that his work on the cross was for you, that he is the Lord's anointed king with all power and authority, and that his work on our behalf was the fulfillment of promises made long ago.

Tonight we look at the Messianic Psalms. Psalm 22 was the Psalm Jesus prayed on the cross. Psalm 2 reveals deep truths about who Jesus is in relation to God the Father. Psalm 110, our focus for tonight, is one of the most important Psalms for early Christians. It speaks of the victory of our Lord. It tells of the exaltation given to him by the Father. It tells us about who Jesus is- our priest and king. It is a source of great comfort in time of trial. As our time in the Psalms comes to a close I pray that you would be encouraged and enlivened by this incredible Psalm.
