Come, Messiah!

Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; from our fears and sins release us. let us find our rest in thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art; dear desire of every nation, joy of every longing heart.

And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever."

Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz: "Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test." And he said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign.
