### Vicar's Corner

#### Who would Jesus vote for?

There have been many articles to this effect floating around on the internet. As the November election approaches, the "enlightened" voices of cyberspace love to tell you just how our Lord and Savior would've voted. I'd like to encourage you to ignore these articles. Some may mean well, some may even lay down decent principles for Christian decision making, but in order to assign a candidate to Jesus you have to ignore who he was. Jesus never elected his leader. A man from Nazareth 2000 years ago had no say whatsoever in who was governing him. Not the king, not the governor, not the Roman Emperor. Jesus didn't vote. In fact, Jesus ended up on the wrong side of the non-

elected government, dying as a criminal at the hands of leaders he never had a chance to vote for.

So Jesus didn't vote... but Christians do. Our Savior never showed up at a polling location or pulled a lever, but those who bear his name will in droves. The system of government in Jesus' time offered no chance for His voice to be heard, but ours does. God has given His Word to guide our decisions, prayer to ask him for wisdom, and intellect to think through the cons and pros of each candidate. So rather than tell how Jesus would vote (because he didn't) or who you should vote for (because listening to a guy who is voting in just his second presidential election doesn't make much sense), I'd like to lay three suggestions out for you, three things a Christian can do this election cycle.

First, Pray. Pray for wisdom. Pray for guidance. Pray that the people of our country would make the right decision. Pray for the candidates, all of them. Pray for our electoral process. Pray for peace and good government after the dust of the election settles. Whatever trepidation you feel as you struggle with this election, it ought to comfort you that the ruler of all things has invited you to bring your concerns to him.

Second, Repent. You're going to have to make a decision this election. You may love it, you may hate it, but if you are voting, there is a decision to be made. It is reasonable for a Christian to ask God for forgiveness after voting. "Lord, I made the decision I thought was best. Forgive me if I was wrong. Forgive my stubborn trust in earthly authorities above Your authority."

Third, Rejoice. Our trust doesn't lie in Donald Trump, Hillary Clinton, our other elected officials, or even the United States government. Psalm 146 reminds us "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation." There is no salvation to be found in any of these candidates, but we can rejoice that we have faith in the only one in whom salvation is found, Jesus Christ. Scripture shows time and time again that earthly governments, powers, and armies are of no consequence to God. He raises up powers and causes them to fall. But we are citizens of a chosen race, purchased with the blood of Jesus. And as our earthly leader changes we can rejoice that the ruler of all things remains the same.

### PRESCHOOL NEWS!

Greetings from the Preschool! We have been very busy this month...and when I say busy, I mean both the students and the staff. We have nearly 150 students this year and a waiting list to boot! God has again blessed us with an abundance of little children to share the good news of Jesus Christ.

Fall is an awesome time of year at the school. It's filled with field trips to pumpkin patches, the trolley museum and visits from Firefighter Phil and a Dental hygienist, and even made our own toothpaste...minty fresh! Take a walk down the hallway and notice the artwork hanging on the walls and from the ceiling, it's our own little art gallery and it's beautiful. Did I mention that we were busy?


We have also been learning about creation this month and how God created the world in 6 days and rested on day seven. Each classroom has been "creating" a bulletin board adding different items for each day of creation. At the end of each creation day the children look at the bulletin board and say "it is good!" We also had our first chapel lesson of the year, "The Parable of the pumpkin". To convey the Gospel message in a visual way and in keeping the fall season, we use two carved pumpkins. The pumpkins presented to the children are side by side, one smiling with a candle lit inside, representing life with Jesus, and the other frowning and dark inside, representing life without Jesus. The lesson differentiates a life with Jesus, contrasted to what it is like to live without Jesus. I tell the children that Jesus is the Light of the World, and that He can provide a light to guide their lives if they love Him with their whole heart. "For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ." 2 Corinthians 4:6.

On behalf of the staff, and myself, "Thank You" for helping us with many of the items on our "Wish List". With the size of our school, we have many needs that come up, and not always the means to achieve them. Your kindness and generosity is greatly appreciated. Thank you again.
