Large outflows designated as Plant Operation caused the month's negative cash flow. At the end of October, Zion has a cash position totaling \$24,665.68 and is slightly behind the year-to-date budget.

Please continue to pray for Zion and support our ministries with your time, talents and treasures. May God continue to bless us as we boldly speak the name of Jesus to a world in desperate need of His grace.

November Council Meeting Highlights

On behalf of the Audit Committee, Dale Miller presented recommendations from the Committee's work. A large number of operational improvements were noted. The key to capturing these opportunities will be follow through and accountability.

ZLCB Youth Director Joe Faini described his process for reaching middle and high school students with the Gospel. These are critical years when friendships tend to drive interests and perspective of individuals. Joe challenged ZLCB to plan and execute on events geared toward the younger students within this age group.

The Council appointed the following as members of a committee whose mandate will be to determine what ZLCB needs from Shepherd's Staff and who will have responsibility, accountability and ownership of the data. ZLCB owns the rights to this system and has been utilizing it but not to its full capability.



Vicar's Book of the Month

Coming in December we will beginning Vicar's Book of the month. We read a lot of Scripture here at Zion- as we should! But if you are looking to expand your reading to another book, which book should you start with? Every month we will have 2 copies of the book of the month in the library, free for you to check out! This month's book is "The Trinity: How not to be a heretic" by Stephen Bullivant. Here is a brief description of the book from Amazon:

The Trinity is Christianity's most basic description of who God actually is and who he needs to be in order to save us. It is at the very heart of what Christians believe, and very little else in Christianity makes sense without it.



The central idea of this book is that, contrary to popular assumption, the Trinity is a very simple doctrine. It consists of just three short, deeply scriptural convictions: i) There is only one God; ii) Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are all God; and iii) Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are not the same. The Trinity: How Not to Be a Heretic explains how the earliest Christians came to be convinced by each statement, why they matter, and how slowly, over a period of several centuries it found a way of saying all three at once. Its sole purpose is to help Christians of all kinds better understand the Trinity so that they can then help others Christians, non-Christians, and maybe even some not-yet-Christians better understand it too.



On Saturday, November 11th, a group from Zion went to pray outside the planned parenthood abortion clinic in Pittsburgh. It was an eye-opening experience that taught us about sin, the great need that women and families have in our country, and being mocked for the sake of Christ. I could tell you all about it here, but I'd rather you talk to Kenny Wuerthele, Susie Bishop, June Malachosky, or Dwight Weldon, who were there. Go talk to them and hear about this experience!




