

# Welcome to worship!

Isaiah is often called the evangelist of the Old Testament. Sometimes the book of Isaiah is humorously (but accurately) referred to as the "Gospel of Isaiah". While Isaiah never mentions Jesus by name, his book is FULL of proclamation that points to Jesus and what he has done. Consider Isaiah 53:5:

"But he was pierced for our transgressions;

he was crushed for our iniquities;

upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace,

and with his wounds we are healed." As Christians, we CAN'T read this passage without thinking of Jesus and His work on the cross. The authors of the New Testament help us by referring to Isaiah over and over again as they explain who Christ is and what he has done.

In the immediate context, Isaiah deals with Israel in a time of prosperity, bringing a message of judgment and exile. But he also gives a message of hope and restoration to come. God will preserve a remnant for himself among those in Israel, and will redeem them through the work of his servant. Good news is shown to be greater news as we learn that Yahweh's salvation will be extended not only Israel, but the gentiles as well through the work of His servant.

We have lot's to explore this morning, as we look at the second so called "servant song". We'll examine the passage in its' context. we'll talk about the work of Christ on our behalf. We will rejoice that the good news is for everyone and we will think about our role in making known the Salvation given to us by the Servant of Yahweh, Jesus Christ. There is a sermon notes handout to keep us on track. May God bless your worship this morning!

# Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 49:1-7

Listen to me, O coastlands, and give attention, you peoples from afar. The Lord called me from the womb, from the body of my mother he named my name. He made my mouth like a sharp sword; in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow; in his quiver he hid me away. And he said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified." But I said, "I have labored in vain; I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my right is with the Lord, and my recompense with my God."

And now the Lord says, he who formed me from the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him; and that Israel might be gathered to him—for I am honored in the eyes of the Lord, and my God has become my strength—he says: "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to bring back the preserved of Israel; I will make you as a light for the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." ## **Gospel Reading:**

<u> John 1:29-42a</u>

The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me.' I myself did not know him, but for this purpose I came baptizing with water, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."

The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples, and he looked at Jesus as he walked by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. Jesus turned and

saw them following and said to them, "What are you seeking?" And they said to him, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and you will see." So they came and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day, for it was about the tenth hour. One of the two who heard John speak and followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which means Christ). He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John. You shall be called Cephas" (which means Peter).


