Vicar's Corner

One of the games that we like to play in confirmation class is "Is it Law or Gospel?". I mention a situation or event to the students and then they have to decide if it is the good news of the gospel from God (something God does for us, Jesus) or terrifying news of the law (something God requires from us). As an example we'll take the pastor's words in the absolution "I forgive you all your sins". Is that law or gospel? The answer is gospel! What about the apostle John's exhortation "love one another?". Is this law or gospel? Because it is something required of us, we would label this command as law. The primary use of

this law/gospel distinction is in the interpretation of Scripture. For the preacher and the reader it is important to know "is God requiring something of me or freely giving me something in this text?". But law and gospel show up in our lives as well.

As we begin the new year, I'd like us to consider the law and gospel aspects of the new year. Is the coming of the new year law or gospel for the Christian? It depends on how you think of it. If a new year is a fresh start, a new beginning, then you probably think the start of the year is "good news" at least in the general sense. There are, however, law aspects to the new year. Many people start the new year with a new year's resolution, something they require of themselves, something to do. Many people fear what will come in the new year, fearing they won't meet their goals, or that the next year will fall short of their expectations.

More specifically for the Christian, we see both law and gospel elements to the new year. The new year does have some law aspects to it. As Christians, considering anew what God requires of us is appropriate as we enter a new year. Have you been attending church? How is your thought life? How is your prayer life? Are you reading God's Word? Is there a sinful habit that you need to eliminate?. These are law questions, but important ones as Christians, and the new year is a good time to ask them. All of us will have different answers to those questions, but we all share in the fact that those answers will be insufficient, which is why we also take note of the gospel aspects of the new year. 2017 will be another year as a baptized child of God. 2017 is another year where God offers you his grace again and again and again in His Word and Sacraments. 2017 will be another year of God's forgiveness covering your sins. Most exciting of all, 2017 may just be the year our Lord returns!

This month's book is perfect for the start of the new year! Robert Kolb's "The Christian Faith" is a classic that explores the basic beliefs of the Christian Faith in simple terms. One of the unique aspects of this book is that it functions both as a tool for theological learning and a devotional tool. Kolb discusses the faith in order to teach, but in this book you also hear the Gospel proclaimed to you. The most impactful part of this book for me was Kolb's discussion about baptism. He says that baptism is a rehearsal for judgment day. In baptism God says "you are righteous", "you are mine". On judgment day he will repeat those proclamations as he welcomes you into His eternal kingdom! Amazing gospel! Check it out in Zion's library starting in January!
