

Welcome to worship!

This evening is one of the most somber and reserved nights in the church year. Ash Wednesday is one of two days where the liturgical color is black (the other being Good Friday). We come together to reflect on who we are. We are sinners. We are mortal. We are dust. Our altar paraments reflect the blackness of our old, sinful, hearts. The cross on our forehead reminds us that we are dust, and to dust we will return

Our service this evening will be more laid back. We won't have any energetic announcements of joyful hymns. We also begin our fast from the word "Alleluia" tonight. The service will include several periods of silence for reflection and meditation.

All of this is for a purpose. We don't do this very often in our church. Our lives are consumed, as they should be, with the joy that Jesus has risen and because of Him we have eternal life, even now. But tonight, we reflect on who we are as sinners. This is a timely reminder that we must continually fight against the "old man" in us. In Lent, we examine who we are as sinners, which intensifies our joy at who we are in Christ! The blackness of our old heart magnifies the new, pure heart that God creates in us. Focusing on our mortality magnifies the glory of the resurrection of Christ! It may be uncomfortable. It is difficult to look at our sin. But when we see our sin, we are left with nowhere to turn but our Savior.

Psalm *Psalm* 51:1–13

- V Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.
- Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!
- **V** For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.
- Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.
- V Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.
- Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart.

At this time, the congregation will come forward for the imposition of ashes. The ushers will dismiss each row, forming a single file line up to the steps. Each person will receive the sign of the cross on their forehead, and Vicar will speak the words:

V Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

Please return to your seats and meditate in silence. Psalms 51 and 32 in the beginning of your hymnal are suitable for an Ash Wednesday meditation.

Readings from Holy Scripture

Joel 2: 12-19

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. Who knows whether he will not turn and relent. and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast: call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders: gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'"

Then the LORD became jealous for his land and had pity on his people.
The LORD answered and said to his people, "Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.

Silence for reflection.

2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For he says,

"In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

Silence for reflection.

Matthew 6:1-6,16-21

[Jesus said:] "Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.

"Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

Matthew 6:1-6,16-21

"And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

[Jesus said:] "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
