One of the many things I love about our church season is that it keeps going! For example, in the secular world, Christmas is done and over with in one day. After the presents are all opened, a depressive sorrow sets in to many secular minds because the "fun" is all done. Likewise with the secular world's view of Easter. After the eggs are all found and the chocolate is all eaten, the only thing the world is left with is a tummy-ache!

But not in the church! In the church, we get to celebrate Christmas for weeks. The same goes for Easter. We are going to celebrate Easter not just for a day or two, but for a whole SEASON! And during this season of Easter, we are able to stay fixated upon the Easter resurrection of Christ and to view it from many different angles, and from many different sides – much in the same way you would with a beautiful diamond; turning it around and around to gaze upon its beauty from so many different sides and angles.

One beautiful facet of Easter we can view is the resurrection appearances of Christ. Late in the evening on Easter Sunday, Jesus appeared to two disciples who were walking on the road to the town of Emmaus. These two men saw Jesus, but didn't realize it was Jesus. They saw Jesus walking right next to them, but they didn't realize this was the resurrected Jesus. They were staring right into the brilliance of the Son of God's face, but they did not realize this was the Son of God. They walked and talked with God, but didn't even realize it.

But then all of this changed. As soon as Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to them – a veil fell away from their eyes and they finally saw Jesus for who He is; the Passover lamb who is risen from the dead and whose reign will never end! I pray during this Easter season, and every season of the church year, that our eyes would never deceive us. Look upon Christ as the one who was slain, but now who lives and reigns forever and ever. Gaze upon Him as you would a many faceted diamond always seeing the different ways He loves you, comes to you, keeps His promises to you, and how He will never fail you.

The Easter Season

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

The buzz of Easter Sunday has gone away. The special flowers are gone from the altar, the brass quartet isn't playing every Sunday, church attendance has gone back to the regular pattern. Some of the fanfare of Easter has indeed vanished, but this month I'd like you to remember- we're still in the season of Easter!

The joy of the resurrection of Jesus is far too great to be contained on one day, however special our celebration of Easter may be. The glorious news that Jesus was not in the tomb, that He has risen, never to die again takes up an entire season on our church calendar. Have you noticed the colors on the altar and on pastor's stole? They're still white. Our hymns are still hymns proclaiming the resurrection. Our worship services are still services of Easter joy!

Even after the season of Easter ends and our focus shifts, we can also remember that each Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection! We gather for worship on Sunday mornings because Christ rose from the dead that third day. We wake up early, just as the women did on that first Easter. We come to church to find a living Christ, just as Mary Magdalene found at the tomb! The resurrection of Jesus is the single most important event in human history. He broke the pattern that existed from the fall until his resurrection. To this day, Jesus is the only one to rise from the dead and never die again. And as glorious as that fact is, even greater is the fact that the resurrection of Jesus is your resurrection as well! The resurrection of Jesus guaranteed resurrection for you, and foreshadowed that day when all the dead will rise. Each worship service, and each day of the life of a Christian is lived in this resurrection joy and hope.

As the wonderful hymn "At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing" says:

"Easter triumph, Easter joy, this alone can sin destroy! From sin's power, Lord, set us free, new-born souls in you to be. Alleluia!"

The triumph and joy or the resurrection go with us. Because Christ has risen from the dead, because we serve a living Lord, because the resurrection of Jesus is your resurrection we can joyously say "Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!" throughout the entire Easter season and all year round.


Christ is risen... and ascended!

We continue to transfer money into the Pastor vacancy fund to cover moving and miscellaneous expenses for Pastor Grimenstein and family. The various growth funds continue to have a strong cash position. Overall Zion's financial situation continues to be solid with income ahead of budget year to date.

Church and Parsonage Repairs & Renovation Projects

The Church Council reviewed and approved the Trustees recommendation to renovate the parsonage. The project will include modifying one side of the garage into two bedrooms as well as refreshing the basement family room and powder room. We are pleased that Tevia and Pastor are willing to move into the parsonage. This is a real advantage for both the Grimenstein family and Zion.


You might have also noticed that the front yard of the parsonage was dug up to repair a gas leak at a cost of \$5,445 to replace cast iron pipe with plastic pipe from the school to the parsonage. The gas company passed the work and the Trustees completed the re-planting of grass.




Thank You




